Federation Improvement Priorities

This term, we thought we would share our Quality of Education priorities with you:

Oracy and Reading:

To develop and improve oracy.

To create language rich environments linked to areas and subjects.

To improve reading skills in order to increase the percentage of children working at and beyond ARE expectations.

Nursery Curriculum:

To develop detailed curriculum plans for the nursery

Nursery Assessment:

Implement the use of OPAL assessments to complete effective assessment of pupils.

More Able:

To increase the proportions of children working at greater depth in all areas of the curriculum, with a particular focus that a greater number of children leave KS2 working at greater depth.

Boys:

To increase the proportions of boys working at expected and greater depth in all areas of the curriculum.

Cognitive Load:

To assist the children with developing effective strategies so that knowledge sticks and can be recalled in the future.

Leaders and Governors will be monitoring against these objectives throughout the year.
