Thank you to everyone who completed our Governor Survey. This helps to inform us on your views and where we can work with the Federation to improve further. It was pleasing to see that 100% of parents and carers believed that their child felt safe in Nursery and School.

Over 98% agree that their child knows who to speak to if they are upset and unhappy and that the Federation has a positive and respectful culture. In addition, 95% know who to approach in school if they have queries and concerns and over 86% feel that Federation communication is effective and timely which is an improving situation which we will continue to work on next year.

We specifically asked you about our first Ox Fest and overall the majority of comments were extremely supportive and positive. Some suggestions have been made and we will consider them when planning next year's event.

We also wanted your feedback on opportunities to attend Nursery/School events. From 43 written responses, the results were:

- 27 responses were supportive of the event and would not want anything to change.
- Further work needed on managing the expectations of younger children when family
 members are unable to attend due to work commitments (2 responses).
- Less events (1 response).
- Move some events where possible to mid afternoon/evening to allow some working parents the chance to attend more (5 responses).
- More events in Key Stage Two (4 responses).
- Better staggering of events across the term (2 responses).
- Better communication of forthcoming events (2 responses).

In regard to additional comments, from the 42 responses we had 4 constructive suggestions which we will consider for the new year.

What do the Governors do?

We have three core functions which are:

- Giving the school a clear vision, ethos and strategic direction.
- Holding the Executive Headteacher to account for the educational performance of the school and its pupils.
- Overseeing the financial performance of the school and making sure its money is well spent.

Federation Improvement Priorities

Leaders and Governors have been busy analysing data, surveys and monitoring teaching and learning in school to identify the priorities for the next academic year.

Here is a summary of what we will be working on to improve further:

QUALITY OF EDUCATION

Writing - To enhance the writing curriculum in order to develop the children's writing skills and increase the percentage of children working at and beyond age related expectations.

Cognitive Load - To assist the children with developing effective strategies so that knowledge sticks and can be recalled in the future. To explore methods of assessment to check on knowledge retention.

BEHAVIOUR AND ATTITUDES

To reduce the number of persistent absentees and close the gap between vulnerable groups.

To ensure that our younger children know what behaviours for learning look like.

To ensure that there is a consistent approach to behaviour at all points during the school day.

PERSONAL DEVELOPMENT

To embed the ENRICHED values and use these as a vehicle to prepare the children for their future.

To continue to promote positive equality and diversity and celebrate differences across the Federation.

To map out Cultural Capital from Nursery to Year 6 to ensure children are given a wide range of experiences.

EARLY YEARS

To ensure opportunities for communication and language are embedded in all areas of the curriculum in order to increase the number of children reaching age related expectations in the Communication and Language Early Learning Goal.

To develop the environments to maximise opportunities for learning.

LEADERSHIP AND MANAGEMENT

To develop a robust assessment system for wider curriculum subjects. To continue the transition towards amalgamation and move to the new site in September 2024.
