HOW DO RIVERS FORM AND WHY DO SETTLEMENTS ESTABLISH THEMSELVES NEARBY?



GEOGRAPHY

Years 5 and 6 will be studying the formation of rivers, from source to mouth. They will be locating national and worldwide examples, as well as looking at the links between rivers and the settlements that have emerged around them.

Science

Year 5 will be looking at the properties of different materials, how these can be tested and their uses in our daily lives. Year 6 will investigate buoyancy and the factors that can affect this. They will test out their predictions using a series of practical investigations.

RE

RE this half term will focus on the Easter story, recalling the key events of the week leading to Jesus' death. We will be studying Good Friday and Easter Sunday, and why these particular days are so important to Christians and their beliefs.

PE

Children will be playing Tag Rugby this half term, looking at passing backwards and intercepting the ball in order to complete group plays. In their second session, pupils will be working on their fitness, building their stamina and endurance through a range of drills and challenges.



ART AND MUSIC

Children will be introduced to how artists can use art as a way to express their opinions. They will then go on to make art about things they care about. In Music, we will be finding out what is meant by the 'key' of the music.



RSE

Year 5 will be thinking about the ways in which we can promote body positivity and the effects of harmful substances. Year 6 will learn how to keep safe online and in their daily routines, as well as what to do in the case of an emergency.
